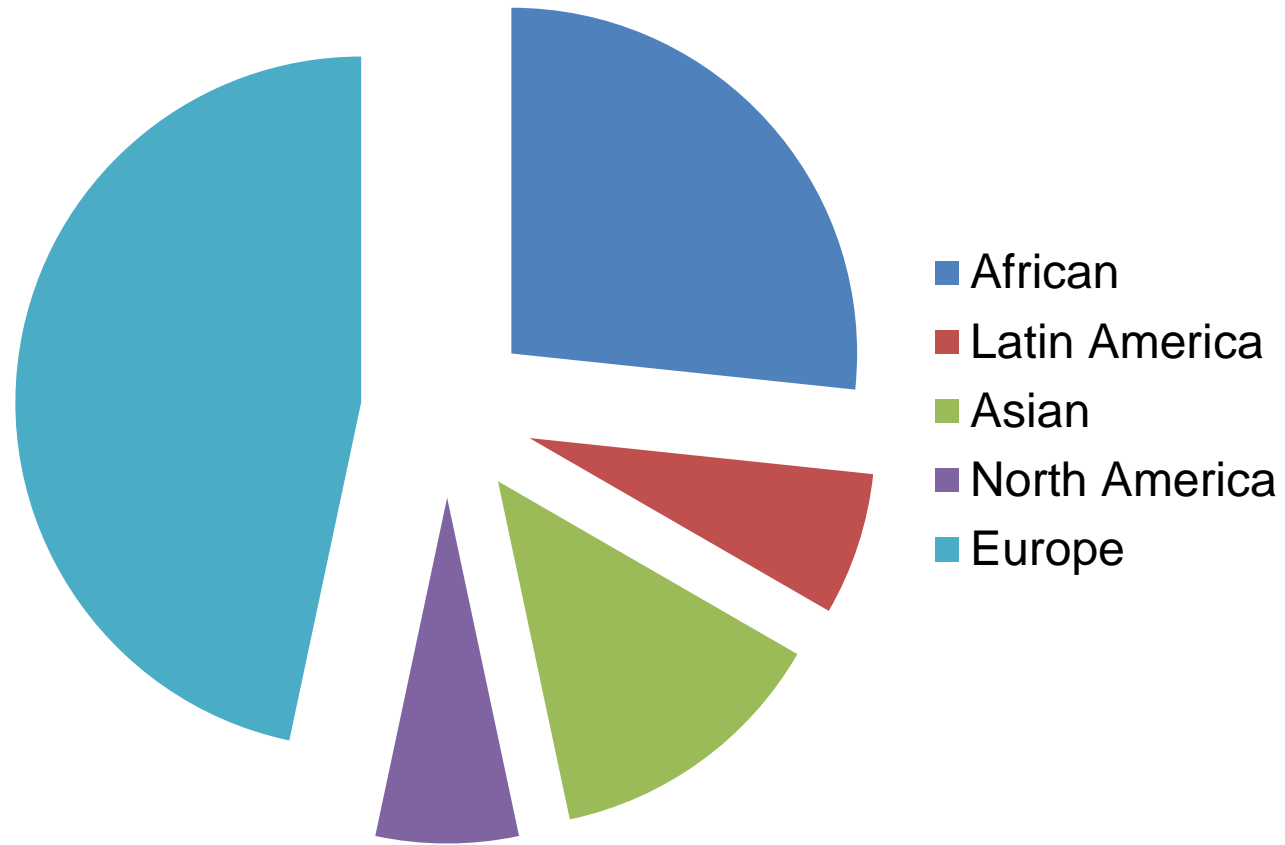

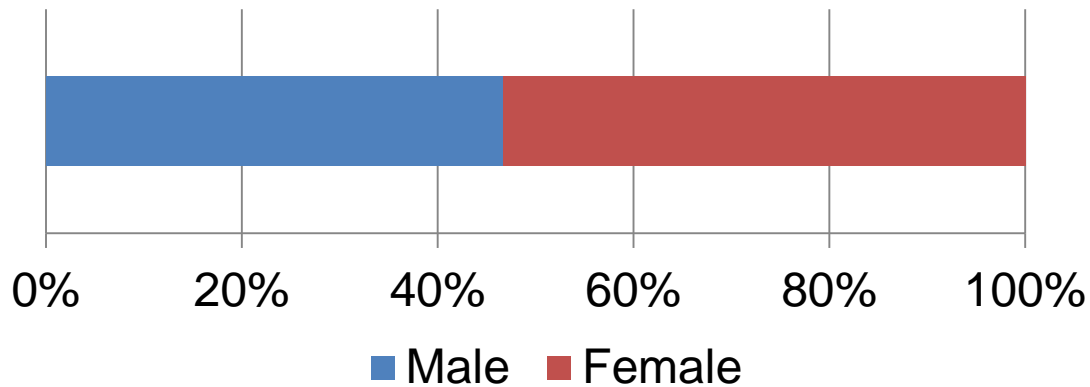

Group 1: Sustainability & resilience

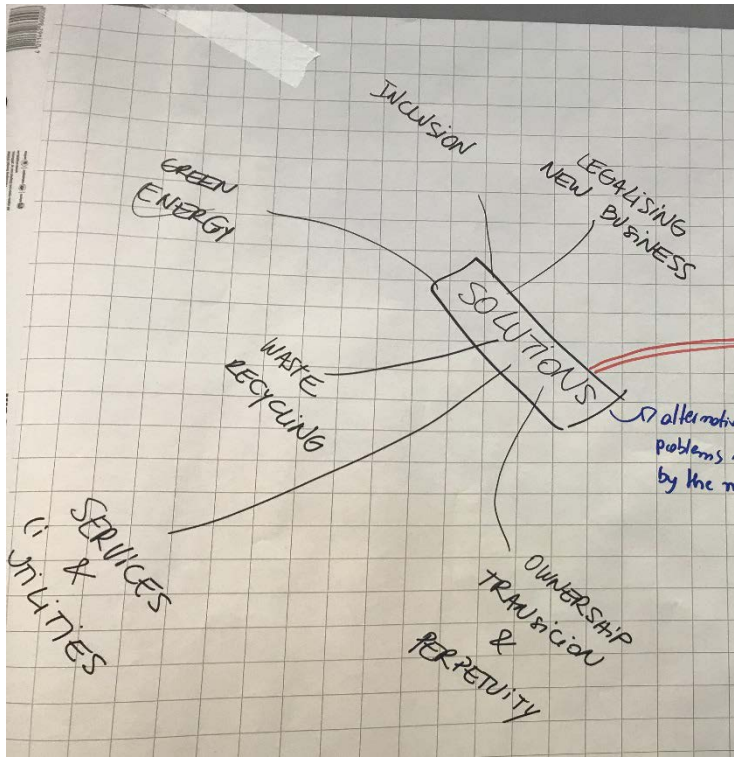
Towards sustainable food systems: What is the role of producer organisations in organic food chains?

- Role as academics is to highlight the potential that cooperatives can bring in its whole spectrum

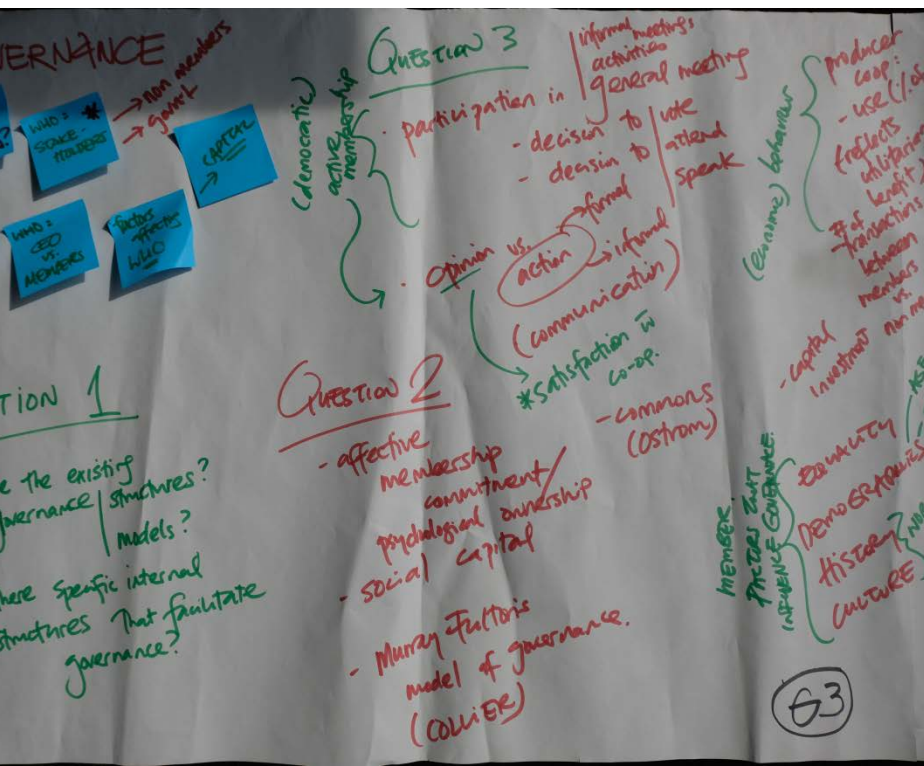

Conclusion:

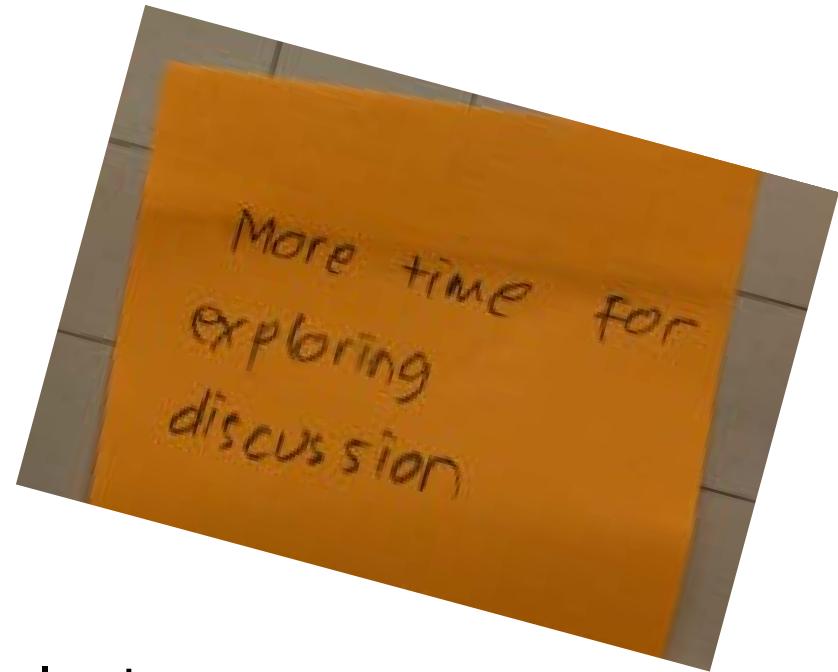
- Both quantitative & qualitative studies, different indicators

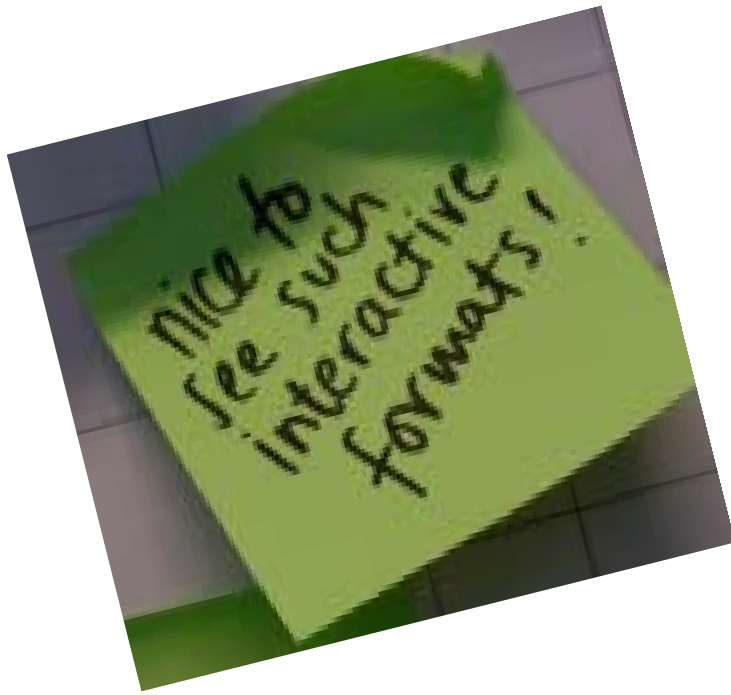
